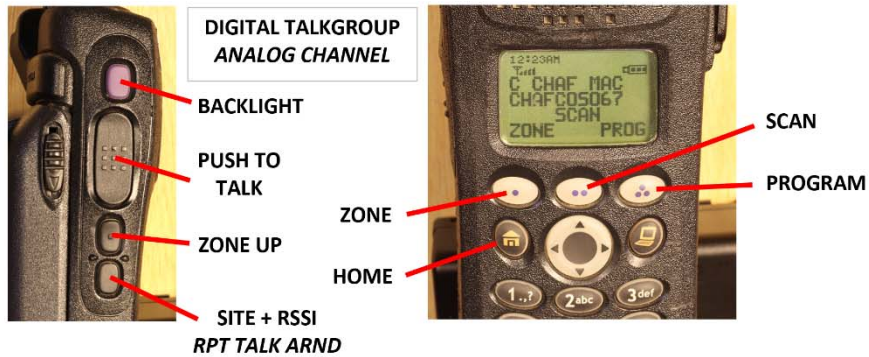

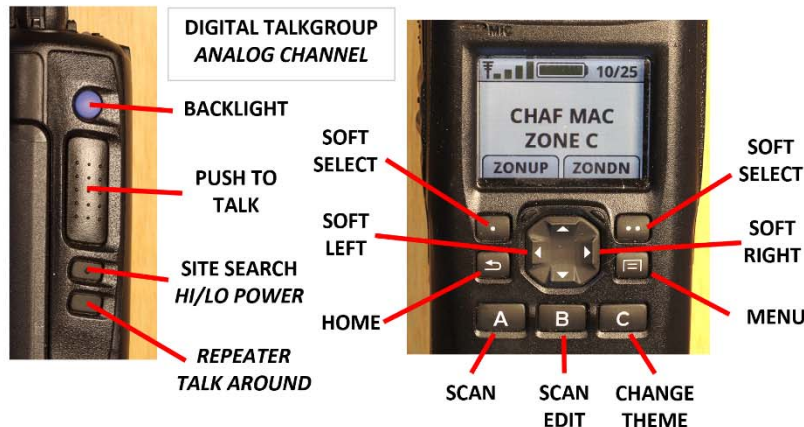

Aircraft passengers must **turn off** radios on digital repeater

Regional, state, and national channels are **strictly regulated**. Each incident requires permission from the authorizing agency. Dispatch should be able to get authorization. **Never** drag a local digital repeater out of your local area - Ties up a channel on all the towers between you and there - Use travel channel - Can get radio remotely disabled **Never** monitor a distant digital repeater for an incident you are not assigned - Ties up a channel on all the towers between you and there - Can get radio remotely disabled Use scanning only if you need it - Only hear a secondary channel if primary is not in use - Not hear secondary channel unless someone using the tower has it as primary

### Radio Etiquette

Before transmitting listen to be sure the channel is clear

- Is an answer expected from the last transmission? Wait for it

On 800 DTR press PTT for half second before speaking

- You will hear a permit-to-talk chirp, then speak

Say who you are calling followed by who you are

- Command – Team 1
- If initial call, after names, state what radio you are using i.e. MRA, Chaffee MAC, etc.
- If initial call, wait for acknowledgement, Team 1 – Command, go ahead
- If multiple missions occurring, command needs geographic designation or mission name, Command – McCoy Team 1

Make your transmission concise and courteous

- Assume other agencies, the public and the subject's family are listening and be professional
- Code word for deceased subject – we use code Frank
- MRA Codes may be used on mutual aid missions
  - 1 – Subject found OK, no assistance needed
  - 2 – Subject found, assistance needed
  - 3 – Team member in need of assistance
  - 4 – Subject found dead (usually preceded by code 5)
  - 5 – Isolate radios and/or turn volume down; prepare for next transmission. Typically used prior to code 4

### Mission Use Cases

Monitor VHF and 800 DTR in all vehicles in motion

- Leave engine running if parked for more than half an hour

Try to have a VHF radio for every person

- Only need to have one turned on if the group is close together

Try to have at least an 800 DTR for every two people

- If a large team splits into smaller teams each small team will have an 800 DTR

Typical VHF vs 800 DTR Usage – Will vary as needed by location

- VHF – Used for intra/inter team communication, trailhead to teams, sometimes trailhead to IC – Usually MRA
- 800 DTR – IC to dispatch, sometimes IC to teams, sometimes trailhead to IC, sometimes trailhead to teams – Usually Chaffee MAC
- For VHF and 800 DTR simplex offer to relay a message if you can hear both ends and they cannot hear each other
- If a long mission is expected conserve battery power by turning off redundant radios

Leave a radio on when you bivvy

- Subject may call dispatch or IC by cell phone and you need to know what they are up to, also a team that did not bivvy may need your help

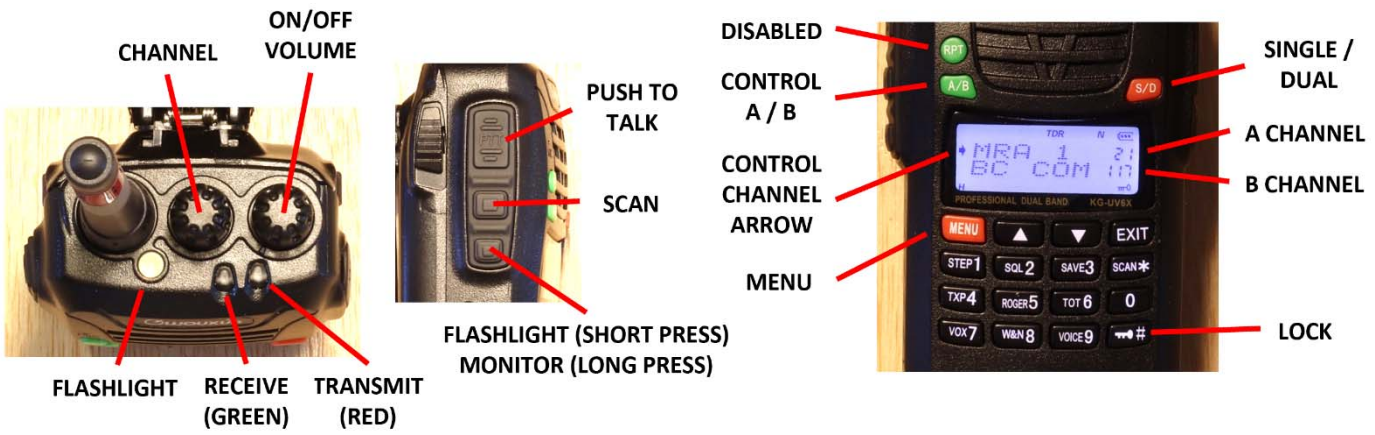

Back Country Access uses Family Radio Service and General Mobile Radio Service channels. The radio will scan these 22 channels. You will hear all conversations when using the BCA and F GR channels but they will not hear you transmit unless you set the same transmit privacy tone as they are using. Menu 32 can detect the code.

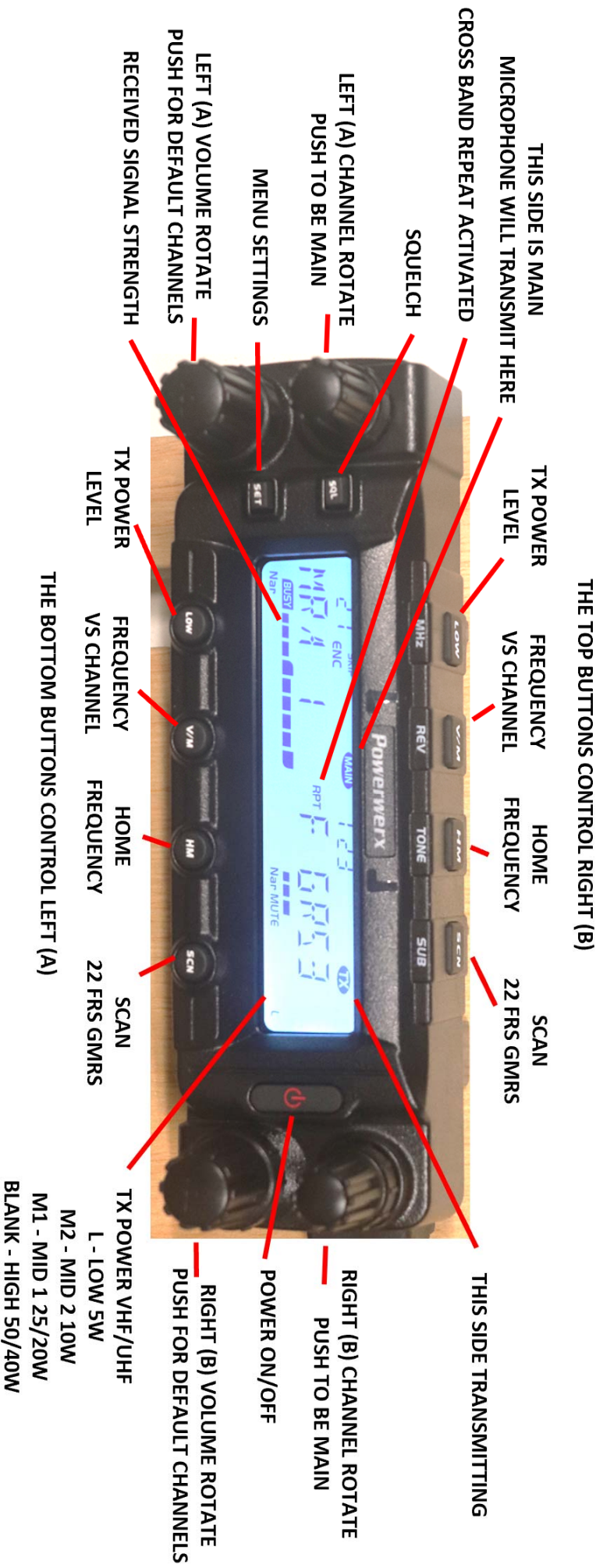

**Cross Band Repeater**

In Cross Band Repeat the radio retransmits anything received on the VHF band onto the UHF band and vice-versa; one band at a time.

Set Left (A) side to VHF channel and Right (B) side to UHF channel.  
 Press SET key to enter menu and turn main channel knob to 44 X-RPT.  
 Press main selector knob to display XSTART; press again to display RPT.  
 To turn off press SET.

**Tone Encode**

Tones are also known as CTCSS, privacy tones, sub channels, etc.  
 If a radio has tone decode it will only hear stations that encode the tone.  
 Tones are entered as a frequency in decimal Hertz.  
 If the receiving radio's tone decode frequency is know it may be entered.  
 The handheld radios can display tone frequencies that they receive.

Set the desired side as MAIN.  
 Press the microphone PA key; ENC and tone frequency are displayed.  
 Use microphone Up / Down keys or channel knob to select the frequency.  
 Push channel knob.
